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COLLEGE PRINCIPAL REPORT

REFLECTIONS ON 2022

With an uninterrupted year of in-school classes now almost behind us, schools have reflected on how the school, staff and students (and families) have fared over the past three years and what we wish to achieve in the coming year(s).



We have certainly been reminded of how important

regular, frequent, positive social interaction is for children and adults. Whilst there were some who actually thrived in remote learning, many did not and the return to school has revealed the impact of a lack of socialisation and the close, personal attention that a teacher can offer in a classroom. Teachers have needed to help redevelop the capacity of many students to persevere with tasks. For some, sitting in a classroom and concentrating for an hour required considerable effort – and support from teachers. On the bright side, there has been noticeable progress in students across all levels, as the year has progressed. There was, of course, a heartening level of joy amongst students as soon as they returned to school, early in the year - being with each other, having access to the various in-school programs that they loved (Music, Production and Sport programs featured highly – with Shrek the Musical being such a huge highlight of 2022) and re-engaging with out-of-school activities such as community sport. These were all very important avenues for our young to take, in their recovery from the remote learning periods.

Students have re-engaged with their studies to varying degrees. As we have been determining award recipients for Presentation Evening, we have been struck by the number of students who have settled quickly into their previous strong work ethic and level of focus on their academic endeavours, leadership opportunities and more. We are also aware of students for whom the journey is longer. To this end, 2023 will see a continuance (and in many areas an enhancement) of our focus on students' well-being. We are acutely aware that for students to aspire and to perform to the best of their abilities, they need to feel positively disposed to school, feel connected to friends and to see a purpose for making the effort to persist with their studies. In the coming year we will continue to offer a range of programs to meet the many needs of our students, knowing that the effects of the past three years of living with COVID may be with us for a while.

JUNIOR SCHOOL NEWS

It has been very pleasing to get through the entire year without any major interruptions. This has been particularly important for our Year 8 and Year 9 students who were yet to experience all Norwood has to offer. Students in the Junior



School took advantage of a full year of onsite learning and many co-curricular activities, including; Sport, Music, Lunchtime Clubs, Debating, the Musical and Academic State and National Competitions.

Congratulations to the students who have aspired to work hard and achieve their best. Now is a good time for all students to reflect on the positives and challenges experienced in 2022 and set goals for next year to improve in areas that require attention and excel in areas of strength.

A big thankyou to all the teachers and educational support staff who go above and beyond to provide our students with a stimulating curriculum and a friendly and safe environment.

UNIFORM MATTERS

FINAL WEEKS OF SCHOOL

The last few few weeks at school have seen students completing their exams (the most significant of which were the Year 12 / VCE exams). Last week we ran our VCE Transition Program; introducing students in next years' Years 11 and 12 cohorts to their courses. Final assessments have now been completed and staff have been focusing on completing students' reports and determining recipients for the range of awards that will be celebrated at the Presentation Evening next week.

Awards will be presented for Endeavour, Academic Excellence, Citizenship, Visual and Performing Arts and Sports. The presentations will culminate with the announcement of the Fidelis Awards – the College's premier academic award at each year level.

As has been flagged previously, the 2022 Presentation Evening will be held in the College's Gymnasium. The seating and floor space will allow us to cater for a large audience. The screen will also offer us opportunities we cannot access at our traditional venue.

Today we held our Student Celebration Day, with an excursion to *Funfields* in Whittlesea, a very popular destination in warm weather.

The Celebration Day usually marks the final day for many of our students and the incoming 2023 Year 7 students, who join us on Tuesday next week, will find they have plenty of room to move as they explore the school on their Orientation Day.

Staff are now focussing on preparing their 2023 programs and resources and completing the many other matters that need to be finalised prior to the upcoming break.

As with each 'end of year', we have staff departing Norwood and others joining our team. As we have a new EBA for government schools, we have been dealing with some of the changes to the employment of staff. One significant change from the previous Agreement is the slight reduction in teaching allotments. The decrease in each teacher's allotment, when multiplied by over 80 teachers, has necessitated the employment of an extra 6 teachers for 2023. A summary of staffing movements is below:

SCIENCE NEWS

YEAR 7 SCIENCE

Students in Year 7 Science have been studying ecology and animal adaptations.



As part of their studies, they were required to go out into the school grounds and sample

the population of a species of plant. In this case, the flat weed via correct sampling methods and then justify as to the weed's population density, distribution and number by analysing abiotic and biotic data of the habitat.

Students later used a transect to determine the composition of habitat species and diversity to draw conclusions as to the type of ecosystem they are studying.

WELLBEING OVER THE HOLIDAYS

Whilst the school holiday period is generally a happy time for families to spend together, it can also be a time of additional stress on mental health.

A few tips to reduce the pressure and stay healthy include:

Boost healthy activities - The holidays will not be as health promoting and recharging as they could be if there is too much screen time. Studies suggest that there is an increase in the incidence of cyber-bullying reported during the school holidays. Set limits on technology use and encourage other activities that involve getting outdoors, exercise, socialising with friends and connecting with the community.

Encourage communication - Try to create positive communication practices. Communication with teenagers is often more natural and easier to do when you are doing something together, such as driving, taking a walk, or eating a meal. Talk about school, hobbies and life, use openended questions, keep calm and be non-judgmental. A big part of adolescent development is helping to build their communication and problem-solving strategies. Often being heard is enough. You want your teenagers to know that no matter what it is that is on their mind, you are always there to listen.







Practice mindfulness - Mindfulness is about giving your complete attention to the present moment. Evidence suggests that mindfulness practices can benefit adolescence by building skills in concentration and relaxation, as well as reducing stress and anxiety. Mindfulness can involve formal practices such as meditation and the use of mindfulness apps or informal practices such as colouring, focusing on your senses and taking in your surroundings.
