

students and families.



To our Year 7 students starting secondary school, to those who are new to Norwood this year and to all our other students returning in 2023, it can be an exciting and challenging time. Some strategies that can help create a smooth transition back to school are:



FRIENDSHIPS

Meeting new people and re-connecting with friends can be a daunting idea. Encourage your child to speak with someone new, invite friends on a social outing, join one of the many school groups or join a community based activity. Developing and strengthening friendships gives your child a sense of connection and develops their selfesteem and social skills.



ROUTINE

We have enjoyed our holidays by staying up late and sleeping in, possibly making the return to school a little challenging. Helping your child reintroduce a daily routine for structure and predictability will assist with school engagement and can reduce stress and anxiety.

MANAGING BIG EMOTIONS

Your child may be dealing with challenging emotions when returning to school. There may be excitement of seeing friends, anxiety about social situations or frustration about their earlier wakeup time. Some tips of how to support your child through these 'big' emotions:

- Help your child to get enough sleep, exercise and eat healthy food.
- Check-in: this can be as simple as asking "how was PE today?".
 Starting with a low-pressure question can help ease your child into opening up.
- Validate their feelings: acknowledging how they are feeling instead
 of challenging them. Statements such as "it's okay if you are feeling
 nervous about school tomorrow" can ease stress and anxiety.

Guide your child through emotional regulation strategies, such as deep breathing and mindful activities.








MUSIC NEWS



GENERAL OFFICE NEWS

IMPORTANT INFORMATION – COMPASS EVENTS

The process of using 'Camps, Sports, and Excursion Funds' (CSEF), and credits held on your family accounts, has recently changed. The option previously available in Compass

to "use CSEF for an event" will be removed due to this new process.

The new process is as follows:-

The NSC General Office will now automatically allocate where 🌉 CSEF towards credits events applicable. Please contact the General Office to notify us if you do not want this automatic allocation towards camps/events to occur for your child/children.

For example:

- An event cost is \$25 and you have a credit or CSEF of \$15, the amount owing for the event will be reduced for your child to \$10, therefore using the credit available to offset the cost of the event
- An event cost is \$25 and you have credit or CSEF greater than \$25, the full amount will be offset against the event and future credits or CSEF will be used in the same way.

Please note that consent MUST still be given on Compass for your child to participate in any event.
