


MOBILE PHONES – STUDENT USE

PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the Department's and Norwood Secondary College's (NSC) policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile during school hours.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

- All students at NSC and,
- Students' personal mobile phones brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

DEFINITIONS

A mobile phone is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network.

POLICY

NSC understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At NSC:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at NSC during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

Before and after school

Responsible use of mobile phones is permissible before and after school.

In class

Students are not permitted to have mobile phones in class. Phones should be locked securely in the student's locker.

Recess and lunch

Students are not permitted to access their mobile phone at their lockers and are not permitted to have mobile phones in the schoolyard. Phones should be locked securely in the student's locker.

Camps and excursions & extracurricular activities

In most circumstances, students will not be allowed to bring their mobile phones on overnight school camps or excursions. NSC will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can be brought to special activities and events, including mobile phones.

Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at NSC are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that NSC does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the (NSC's Personal Property Policy AND/OR the Department's <u>Claims for Property Damage and Medical Expenses policy)</u>.

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, NSC will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At NSC students are required to store their phones in their lockers, secured with an appropriate lock.

Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at NSC may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing student engagement polices (Bullying, Student Engagement and Inclusion, and Code of Conduct).

At NSC, the use of mobile phones during school hours, is considered inappropriate if it is used:

- To disrupt the learning of others
- To send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- To engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- To capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- To capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms
- During exams and assessments.

Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
- Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
- Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones Student Use Policy</u>.

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use</u> <u>Policy</u> are:

1. Learning-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
For specific learning activities (class-based exception)	Unit of work, learning sequence
For students for whom a reasonable adjustment to a learning program is needed because of a disability or learning difficulty	Individual Learning Plan, Individual Education Plan

2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
Students with a health condition	Student Health Support Plan
Students who are Young Carers	A localised student record

3. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

Specific exception	Documentation
Travelling to and from excursions	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students on excursions and camps	Risk assessment planning documentation
When students are offsite (not on school grounds) and unsupervised with parental permission	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students with a dual enrolment or who need to undertake intercampus travel	Risk assessment planning documentation

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

NB: Smart watches

Smart watches can only be worn by students for the purpose of checking the time. They must not be used as a cellular device during school hours. Students would be in breach of this policy if they used the functionality of a smart watch in a similar way to that of a mobile phone during school hours, including lunchtime and recess.

NB: Air pods/headphones

Students may also be in breach of this policy if they are found to be wearing headphones/ air pods during school hours, unless permission has been explicitly given by a teacher, in order to access approved learning activities.

Exclusions

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school
- iPads and laptops (see the Digital Learning Policy and the Acceptable Use Agreement)
- Students undertaking workplace learning activities, e.g. work experience
- Students who are undertaking VET.

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Included in staff induction processes and staff training
- Included in staff handbook
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request
